THIS IS YOUR LIBRARY

The East Islip Public Library has provided library services for the communities of East Islip, Islip Terrace and Great River since June 21, 1961. Materials are provided for all ages, pre-schoolers to senior citizens. A professionally trained staff of librarians is available to assist with your search for information and enrich your cultural development.

REFERENCE AND ADULT SERVICES

A trained staff is here to help you find answers to your questions, suggest sources for research projects, and recommend reading materials.

Items not available in our library may be borrowed from other libraries through the Suffolk Cooperative Library System. Reserves may be placed for items in person, online or by phone. There is no charge for these services. Librarians will be happy to assist you with the Online Public Access Catalog and answer reference questions.

Library of Things

The Library has a large collection of items that patrons may borrow. From a variety of oversized lawn games to helpful devices like Wi-Fi hotspots, a telescope, and more. A Reference Librarian will help you reserve these items.

Travel, Health and Consumer Information

The library is often the first place people go for their consumer, health and travel information. Consumer interest materials such as used car prices and product evaluations are always available along with a helpful collection of travel books and DVDs; and an up-to-date collection of consumer health resources.

YA SERVICES

A special collection of books, graphic novels and magazines for grades 7-12 is available in the Teen Bistro. Annual programs include the Summer Reading Club, Young Boater's Course, Baby Sitting Workshop, SAT Prep, and Volunteer opportunities.

Meeting Rooms

The Library's meeting rooms are available to non-profit groups whose meetings are free and open to the public. Applications are available with at least four week's notice from the Public Relations Office.

CHILDREN'S and Parents' Services

The Children's Department has books and materials for children from birth through sixth grade. Various programs are held for this same age group throughout the year. They include infant programs, parent/child workshops, story times, craft workshops and guest performances. We also host a summer reading club each year.

Our collections for children include books, magazines, music, books on CD or Playaway, videos, DVDs, Playaway Views, and foreign language materials. We also offer a parenting collection and a teacher's collection.

There are Internet and word processing computers available in the Children's Room for children through sixth grade. Children's Librarians are available to assist you with questions, reserves, computer access and reader's advisory.

Recreational discount tickets are available-6 per family.

COPIERS and Microfilm Reader/Printers

Coin-operated copiers, coin-operated microfilm reader/printers, and a color copier/fax/scanner is available to our patrons at all times.

CHECK IT OUT

Our computerized checkout system keeps track of books and other library materials. The standard loan period is 28 days and 14 days for new material. Patrons are required to bring their library cards to check out all materials.

Juvenile cards can only check out items from the children's department.

Most library materials may be renewed for an additional loan period. Exceptions are materials that are on hold.

Most library materials may be reserved. Excluded are magazines and newspapers. Materials not owned by the library may be obtained through interlibrary loan.
